I do hereby Certify that at a Court of Oyer & Terminer held for the County aforesaid, on the 19th day of August in the year 1841, for the trial of Squire a Negroe man Slave the property of Jacob Lincoln committed and charged with feloniously burning a barn the property of Abraham Lincoln of the value of one thousand dollars, that the said Negroe Slave was tried, and found Guilty of the said offense, and sentenced to be hung on the 29th day of October 1841, and that the following Justices composed the Court for said Trial, to wit Abraham Smith, Augustus Waterman, William B.
